**Mark Onslow** is director of the Australian Stuttering Research Centre at The University of Sydney. In addition to his academic appointment at The University of Sydney, he is an adjunct professor at the University of Canterbury, New Zealand. Mark's research interests are the nature and treatment of stuttering. He has taught university courses in stuttering management in three countries and currently teaches research methods to doctoral students at the Australian Stuttering Research Centre. Mark has published more than 100 articles in journals and conference proceedings. He has written a textbook on management of stuttering and with his colleague, Ann Packman, has edited a handbook on early stuttering intervention. He is in constant demand internationally as a speaker on the clinical management of stuttering.

**Ann Packman** is a researcher at the Australian Stuttering Research Centre, The University of Sydney. She has many years of experience in treatment and research with people who stutter. Ann has published many articles on stuttering in peer-reviewed journals and has presented widely at national and international conferences. In her current position, she is involved in a range of research projects on the nature and treatment of stuttering, and she supervises post-graduate research students. Ann is interested in theoretical issues in stuttering and is currently cowriting a text on this topic. Ann has been successful, with colleague Mark Onslow, in attracting funding for stuttering research from the Australian government.

**Elisabeth Harrison** has been the senior speech pathologist at the Stuttering Unit, Bankstown Health Service, Sydney, since 1990. The Stuttering Unit provides stuttering treatment for children and adults, as well as specialist consultation services for speech pathologists. The Stuttering Unit and the Australian Stuttering Research Centre, at The University of Sydney, collaborate in the conduct of clinical research about stuttering treatment. Together, staff from both organizations present professional development courses in stuttering treatment for clinicians.
