**Julie Smart, PhD, LPC, CRC (ret.), LVRC, NCC**, is professor and former director of the Rehabilitation Counseling program at Utah State University. Her first career was as a college teacher of Spanish, and she has continued to utilize her Spanish language skills by translating and field-testing rehabilitation instruments, such as *The Acceptance of Disability Scale* and *Client Satisfaction with Rehabilitation Services Scale*. She has authored or co-authored more than 45 articles in rehabilitation and general counseling journals and also has written 10 book chapters, and two books, *Disability across the Developmental Lifespan* and *Disability, Society, and the Individual*. Her research interests include the rehabilitation of racial and ethnic minority individuals with disabilities, and models of disability. In 1989–1990, Dr. Smart was the recipient of a postdoctoral research fellowship, the Mary E. Switzer Award, from the National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research (NIDRR).
