Nita W. Sundbye is Emeritus Professor of Education at The University of Kansas. She received a B.S. in Education from Arkansas Polytechnic College and M.S. and Ed.D. degrees from the University of Kansas. Dr. Sundbye has taught first and fifth grades in elementary schools in Arkansas and Kansas and has taught remedial reading to students in grades two through eight. At The University of Kansas she taught courses in reading, language arts, remedial reading and reading research. Much of the impetus for the development of the *Essential Sight Words Reading Program* came from her recognition of the need for such materials as she supervised, for more than 30 years, the tutoring of children enrolled for remedial reading instruction with graduate students in reading at The University of Kansas. Dr. Sundbye has been a consultant to school districts and has presented many workshops for teachers in the areas of reading, language arts, and remedial reading. She is the author of basal and remedial reading texts for children in elementary and secondary schools. She is co-author of *Helping the Struggling Reader: What to Teach and How to Teach It*, and other books published by PCI Educational Publishing.

Norma J. Dyck is Emeritus Professor of Education at Kansas State University. A member of the special education faculty, she was responsible for preparing teachers of students with learning disabilities and other special needs. Dr. Dyck received a B.A. in Elementary Education from Bethany College and M.S. and Ed.D. degrees from The University of Kansas. Her dual majors during study for the doctorate were reading and learning disabilities. Dr. Dyck has taught first grade and children with learning disabilities.
