

COMBINATION LOCKS

In October of 1992, two large white-tail bucks were found drowned in a shallow pond. They had battled over the territorial rights and the breeding rights of the females in the vicinity. As they smashed their heads together, their **antlers**

became **entangled**; and they stumbled into the pond. The weight of the weaker one pulled the other under the surface, and they both died. These battles are a natural **instinct** and are common among all species, especially among the males.

A discovery in the western part of the state of Nebraska, near the city of Crawford has revealed a similar battle **millenniums** ago between two giant mammoths. Mammoths are animals from which elephants **evolved**. The enemies will be displayed as they were foundwith their giant tusks locked together. Scientists believe that the central part of the United States was once covered by a huge inland sea.



A new museum called the *Trailside Museum* is planned in Nebraska to show "The Clash of the Titans" and other interesting discoveries from the past. Among other exhibits are a **mesohippus** and a **saber**-toothed tiger.

Nebraska **paleontologists** near the city of Royal have discovered that the state is a real treasure chest of fossil remains. At the Ashfall Fossil Beds State Historical Park, scientists have carefully **excavated** the remains of animals that were killed and buried by a volcano. Skeletons of more mesohippuses, prehistoric rhinoceroses and camels have been uncovered. Rather than build a museum to display the discoveries, scientists at Royal have left the animals exactly as they were found and have built barns over them to protect them from the weather.
