Comparatives: Card 1

Bess and Paul have ice cream. Which one has more ice cream? *Paul | He (right) has more ice cream.*


Who has less ice cream? Bess/She has less ice cream.

Who has a bigger scoop of chocolate ice cream? *Bess | She has a bigger scoop.*

Pete has a glass of soda. Is soda warmer or colder than ice cream? *It is warmer than ice cream*.

Which snack cost the most money? Paul's / His snack cost the most money.

Fix this sentence. Bess has fewer ice cream than Paul. Bess has less ice cream than Paul.

Has/Have, Do/Does: Card 1

Louis has some cookies. What does he have? He has some cookies.


How many cookies does Louis have? He has three cookies.

What do the cookies have in them? They have chocolate chips in them.

If he eats one cookie, how many will he have left? *He will have two left.*

Louis has milk to drink with his cookies. What drink does he have? *He has milk*.

Fix this sentence. Louis have a green shirt. Louis has a green shirt.

Regular/Irregular Past Tense: Card 1

One fish fell out of the bucket. How many fish fell out? *One fish fell out of the bucket.*


How many fish stayed in the bucket? Two fish stayed in the bucket.

Did someone catch these fish? Yes, someone caught these fish.

Where did these fish live before they were caught? These fish lived in the water.

This morning, Ray put water in the bucket for the fish. What did he put in the bucket? He put water in the bucket.

Fix this sentence. Yesterday I eat three fishes. Yesterday I ate three fish.



No-Glamour Grammar Cards

Present Tense: Card 1

Andy raises his hand to answer a question. What does he raise? *He raises his hand.*

Andy is waiting for his teacher to call on him. What is he waiting for? *He is waiting for his teacher to call on him.*

Andy is writing a report. What is he writing? He is writing a report.

He points to something in his book. What does he point to? *He points to something in his book.*

He sits quietly while he waits. What does he do while he waits? *He sits quietly.*

Fix this sentence. He learning in school. He is learning in school.

Questions, Level 1: Card 1

Ask me who is riding the bike. Who is riding the bike?

Ask me why the bike rider is wearing a helmet. Why is the bike rider wearing a helmet?

Ask me what color the helmet is. What color is the helmet?

Ask me how the man is helping. How is the man helping?

Ask me when the man will let go. When will the man let go?
