



## Articulation

- (s, r) What animals are in the picture?  
*dinosaur, birds*
- (r) Make up some words that rhyme with *flower*.
- (s) What are on the dinosaur's back? *spikes*
- (s, r, l) Repeat this sentence.  
The dinosaur has blue spikes.

## Vocabulary

- Concepts
  - Is Denzel the dinosaur missing a few or all of his teeth?  
*a few*
  - Touch the tallest flower. *purple flower*
  - Touch the shortest flower. *pink flower*
- Attribute
  - What do you see that needs sun to grow?  
*flowers, grass*
  - What do you see that is extinct (no longer exists)?  
*dinosaur*
  - Which animal can't fly? *dinosaur*
  - Which animal has feathers? *bird*
- Comparison
  - How are a camel and Denzel the dinosaur the same?  
*hump on back, four legs, tail, big*
  - How are a camel and Denzel the dinosaur different?  
*Denzel has spikes on back, some camels have two humps on back; camel lives in the desert/zoo, dinosaurs (Denzel) extinct/do not exist (live) anymore*
- Synonym
  - Denzel the dinosaur looks silly. What's another word for **silly**? *funny, goofy*
  - Please don't frighten Denzel. What's another word for **frighten**? *scare, spook, shock*
- Antonym
  - Denzel is happy because he found his favorite plant. What is the opposite of **happy**? *unhappy, sad*

- Denzel is nice. What is the opposite of **nice**? *mean*
- What is the opposite of **day**? *night*
- Definition
    - Denzel has friends in the forest. What is a **forest**?  
*place with lots of trees and animals*
    - The sun helps the flowers grow. What does it mean to **grow**? *to get bigger*
  - Listening
    - Denzel likes to take walks. First he passes the pond. Then he walks through the forest. What does Denzel pass before he walks through the forest? *pond*
    - Denzel eats flowers for lunch. His friends Sammy and Barry come to play. What are Denzel's friends' names?  
*Sammy and Barry*
    - Denzel is a herbivore. A herbivore only eats plants and fruits. Does Denzel eat meat? *no*
  - Grammar
    - Correct this sentence. Denzel paws are very big.  
*Denzel's paws are very big.*
    - Correct this sentence. Denzel has three tooths.  
*Denzel has three teeth.*
    - Correct this sentence. The plant have two leafs.  
*The plant has two leaves.*
  - Reasoning
    - Denzel the dinosaur used to have five teeth. How many teeth has he lost? *two*
    - Why don't you see dinosaurs in a forest today? Explain your answer. *Dinosaurs are extinct/ do not exist (live) anymore.*
    - Why didn't all dinosaurs have spikes on their backs?  
*Answers will vary.*
    - How do we know that dinosaurs once lived on Earth?  
*fossil remains, bones*



- Articulation**
- (r) Which is pointy, a carrot or a button? *carrot*
  - (l, s, r) What things can you do in the snow?  
*build snowman/fort, go sledding, snowball fight, make snow angel*
  - (l, s) What happens to snow if the weather gets too hot? *It melts.*
  - (s, r, l) Repeat this sentence. *Snowflakes are falling.*

**Vocabulary**

- Concepts
  - Where is the hat? *on the snowman*
  - Where are the mittens? *on both sides of the snowman, beside the snowman, on the ground*
  - Which snowball is the largest? *bottom snowball*
  - Point to the button on the top. *(student points)*
  - Point to the snowball in the middle. *(student points)*
- Attribute
  - What orange vegetable grows underground? *carrot*
  - What clothing do you wear over your hands when it's cold? *mittens/gloves*
  - Describe the weather. *cold, snowy*
  - How does snow feel? *cold, wet, crunchy*
  - Are the buttons square or round? *round*
- Comparison
  - How are pine needles and leaves the same? *part of/grow on trees, green*
  - How are pine needles and leaves different? *pine needles are long/skinny/sharp, leaves are flat; pine needles stay green and stay on trees all year, leaves turn colors and fall from trees*
- Synonym
  - What is another word for **big**? *large, huge*
  - What is another word for **cold**? *freezing, chilly, nippy*
- Antonym
  - What is the opposite of **top**? *bottom*
  - What is the opposite of **cold**? *hot*
  - What season is the opposite of **winter**? *summer*
- Definition
  - It snows during the winter in some places. What is **winter**? *coldest season of the year*
  - What is a **hat**? *clothing you wear on your head to keep warm/block the sun*

**Listening** It has to be 32 degrees before it will snow. At what temperature will it snow? *32 degrees*  
 These are soft. They are clothing you wear on your hands. What are they? *mittens/gloves*

**Grammar** Correct this sentence. The snowman don't got no arms. *The snowman doesn't have (any) arms.*  
 Correct this sentence. We builded a snowman yesterday. *We built a snowman yesterday.*  
 Correct this sentence. I want to build two more snowmans. *I want to build two more snowmen.*

**Reasoning** What would happen if the sun came out and the temperature went up to 50 degrees?  
*snow/snowman would melt, snowflakes would turn to rain*

Name two kinds of clothes that will keep you warm in cold weather.  
*coat, hat, gloves/mittens, boots, scarf, sweater*

How do you know it's winter in the picture? *snow, snowman, snowflakes*

Why wouldn't you go swimming outside in this weather?  
*too cold, water would freeze/become ice*

How do you know the trees have needles and not leaves?  
*Trees with leaves are bare/show their branches in the winter.*



- Articulation** (s, r) What sport is on the blue shirt? *surfing*  
(r) What color is the dresser? *brown*  
(s) Does the chair have stripes or polka dots? *polka dots*  
(r, s, l) Repeat this sentence. The dresser is tall.

## Vocabulary

- Concepts  
Is the chair taller than the dresser? *no*  
  
Where is the chair? *in front of the dresser, on the floor*
- Attribute  
Which shirt is plain? *white T-shirt*  
What do you see that is sticky? *tape*  
What is bright? *lamp*  
What is comfortable? *chair, T-shirts*  
How many arms does the chair have? *two*  
How many legs does the chair have? *four*  
Are T-shirts dressy or casual? *casual*  
What do people use dressers for? *to keep their folded clothes*
- Comparison  
What is different about the shirt Nina is wearing compared to the other shirts? *collar, color*  
  
How is the “i” on the poster different from the other letters? *lowercase*
- Synonym  
Nina is choosing which shirt to wear. What is another word for **choose**? *decide, select, pick*  
What is another word for **kid**? *child*
- Antonym  
The handles on the dresser are shiny. What is the opposite of **shiny**? *dull*  
What is the opposite of **messy**? *clean, neat, organized*
- Definition  
Bikers are athletes. Who is an **athlete**?  
*someone who is active/plays sports/competes in games or races*  
  
Nina has bangs. What are **bangs**? *hair that comes down over or covers the forehead*

## Listening

This shirt is not on the chair. Nina is not holding or wearing this shirt. Which shirt is it?  
*blue shirt with surfer*

Nina is 12 years old. She is picking out a shirt to wear on a camping trip.  
How old is Nina? *12*

Nina’s younger brother made the poster. He knows that Nina loves flowers.  
Who made the poster? *Nina’s younger brother*

## Grammar

Correct this sentence. Nina holded up two shirts. *Nina held up two shirts.*

Correct this sentence. Both of them shirts is brown. *Both of those/the shirts are brown.*

Correct this sentence. Nina’s brother drew a beautiful poster.  
*Nina’s brother drew a beautiful poster.*

## Reasoning

Why do you think the chair is in front of the dresser?  
*so Nina can reach the top drawer or lamp*

How could the chair in front of the dresser be a problem? *can’t open lower drawers*

Why do people put their clothes on hangers? *don’t want wrinkles, easy to find*



**Articulation** (s, r, l) Which shape is round? *circle*  
(r, l) Which shape has exactly three sides? *triangle*  
(r) What color is the marker? *green*  
(l, r, s) Repeat this sentence. Isabelle drew six rows of shapes.

### Vocabulary

- Concepts Are there more triangles or circles in row two? *circles*  
Look at row three. Are half of the shapes stars? *no*
- Attribute Which shapes have points? *stars, squares, triangles, hearts, diamonds*  
Which shapes are round or have rounded edges? *circles, hearts*  
What emotion/feeling does a heart shape stand for? *love*  
Which shape looks like a pyramid? *triangle*
- Comparison How are a square and a rectangle the same? *shapes, same number sides and corners*  
How are a square and a rectangle different? *rectangle longer, all sides equal on square*  
How are rows two and six the same? *all shapes are purple, triangles*
- Synonym What is another word for **trace**? *copy, draw*
- Antonym There is an even number of rows. What is the opposite of **even**? *odd*  
  
Isabelle was careful when she drew the shapes. What is the opposite of **careful**?  
*careless*
- Definition What is a **pattern**? *something repeated over and over*  
What is a **square**? *shape with four corners and equal sides*  
Who is a **student**? *someone who goes to school to learn*

### Listening

Isabelle's favorite shape is on the paper. It is not a square. It has more points than a triangle. It has fewer points than a star. What is Isabelle's favorite shape? *diamond*

Every shape in this row is the same color. It does not have hearts. Which row is it?  
*row two*

Look at row two. How many more circles than triangles are there? *two*

Listen to this pattern: star, circle, triangle, [pause] star, circle, triangle.  
What comes after star? *circle*

### Grammar

Correct this sentence. She didn't color none of the shapes orange.  
*She didn't color any of the shapes orange.*

Correct this sentence. Isabelle draws good. *Isabelle draws well.*

Correct this sentence. None of them shapes is hard to draw.  
*None of those/the shapes are hard to draw.*

### Reasoning

Why are wheels round? *roll easily*

What could you use to measure the height and width of a rectangle? *ruler, tape measure*

Look around the room. Find something that has a pattern. *Answers will vary.*

Why should you put your name on your homework?  
*so you/your teacher knows whose work it is*
