**Marilyn A. Nippold, PhD**, is a professor in Communication Disorders and Sciences at the University of Oregon. A former public school speech–language pathologist, she obtained her bachelor’s degree in philosophy from the University of California at Los Angeles, her master’s degree in communicative disorders from California State University at Long Beach, and her doctorate in speech–language pathology from Purdue University. She has worked at the University of Oregon since 1982, specializing in later language development, language disorders, and stuttering. Dr. Nippold has published eight books and 120 journal articles and book chapters. For over five years, she served as Editor of *Language, Speech, and Hearing Services in Schools* (2010 through 2015). A licensed speech–language pathologist, Dr. Nippold is a frequent presenter at state, national, and international conferences. She is a Fellow of the American Speech–Language–Hearing Association (ASHA) and received the Editor’s Award for articles published in ASHA journals in 1983 and 2001. In 2015, she received Honors of the Association, ASHA’s highest award for distinguished contributions to the profession of communication sciences and disorders.
