



The zipper is a great invention. It has two rows of plastic or metal teeth. A small grip slides up and down the teeth. The teeth lock and unlock. Elias Howe made the Automatic Continuous Clothing Closure in 1851. He also invented the sewing machine. Howe was too busy to teach people about the first zipper. Whitcomb L. Judson made the clasp locker. He brought it to the Chicago World's Fair in 1893. The clasp locker was made from hooks, eyes, and a slide clasp.

It was not as easy to use as the zippers of today. Gideon Sundback changed the clasp locker in 1912. Sundback made it better. He put spring clips in place of the hooks and eyes. He called it the Hookless Fastener. The B.F. Goodrich Company used the Hookless Fastener on boots in 1923. They called it a zipper. This zipper was put on clothes in the late 1920s. Now, many clothes and other items have zippers.
