Brian keeps the lid on the fish food container so the fish won't be allergic to it.

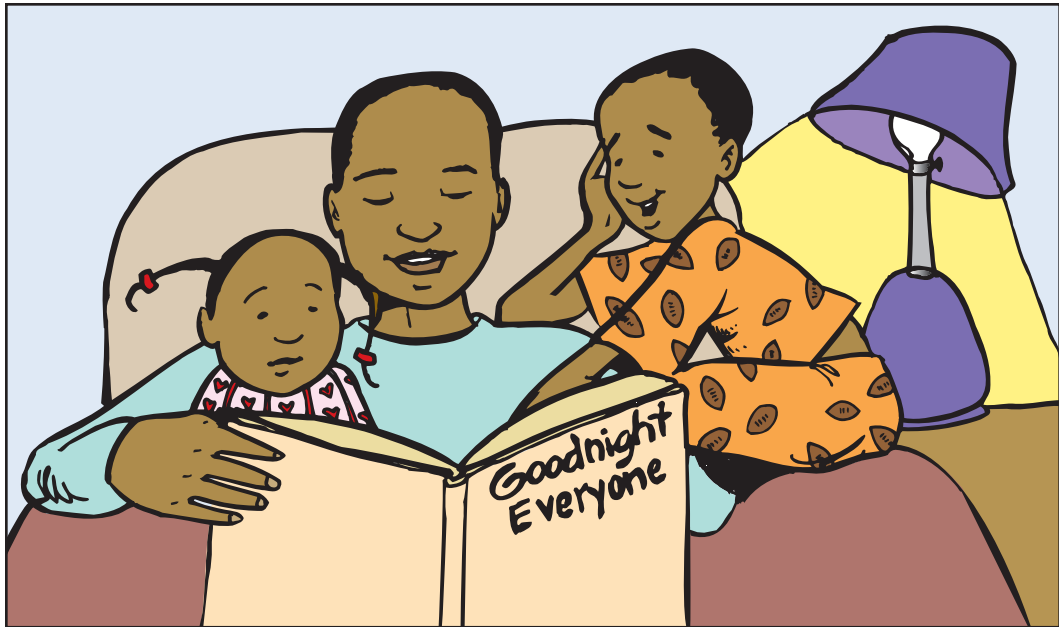
*The lid keeps the fish food fresh.*

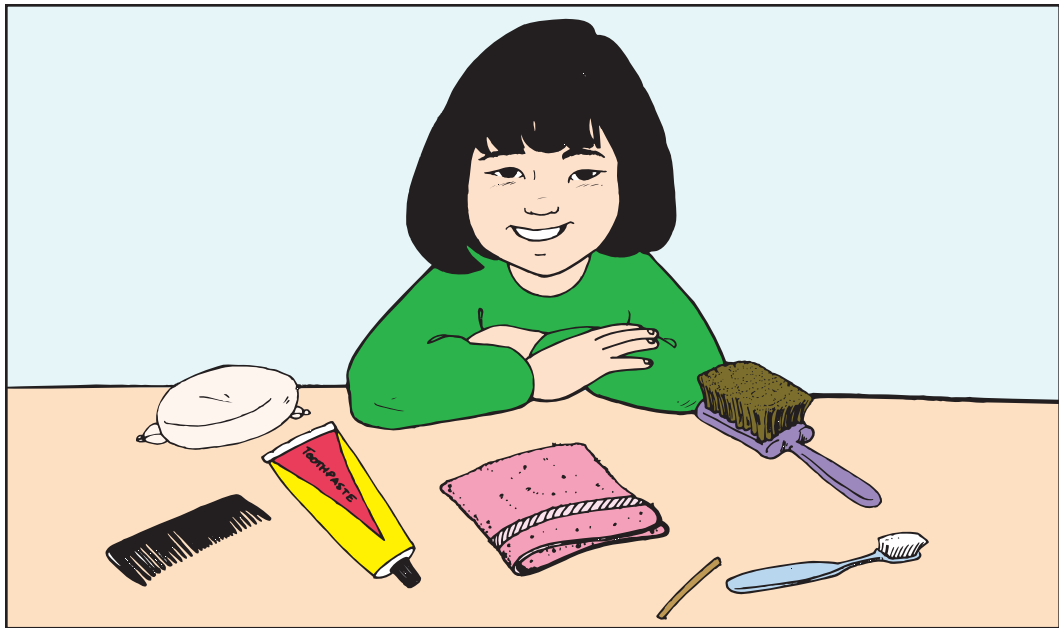

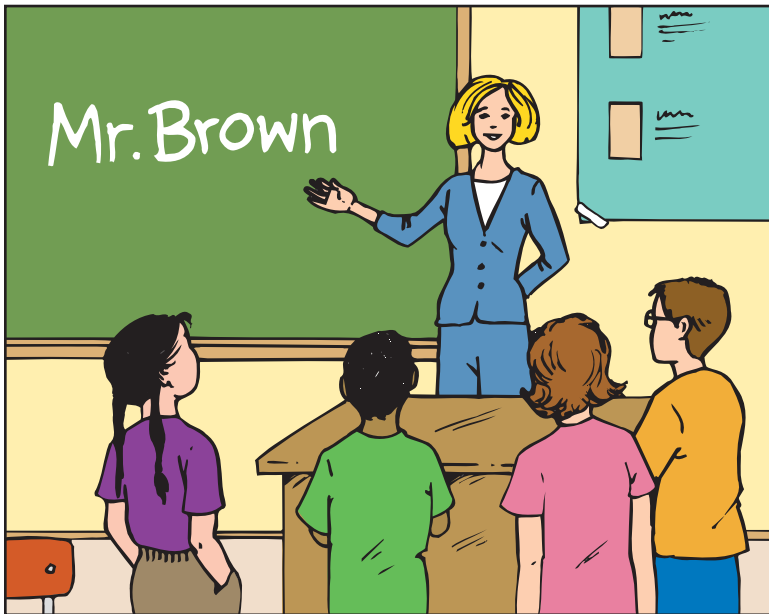

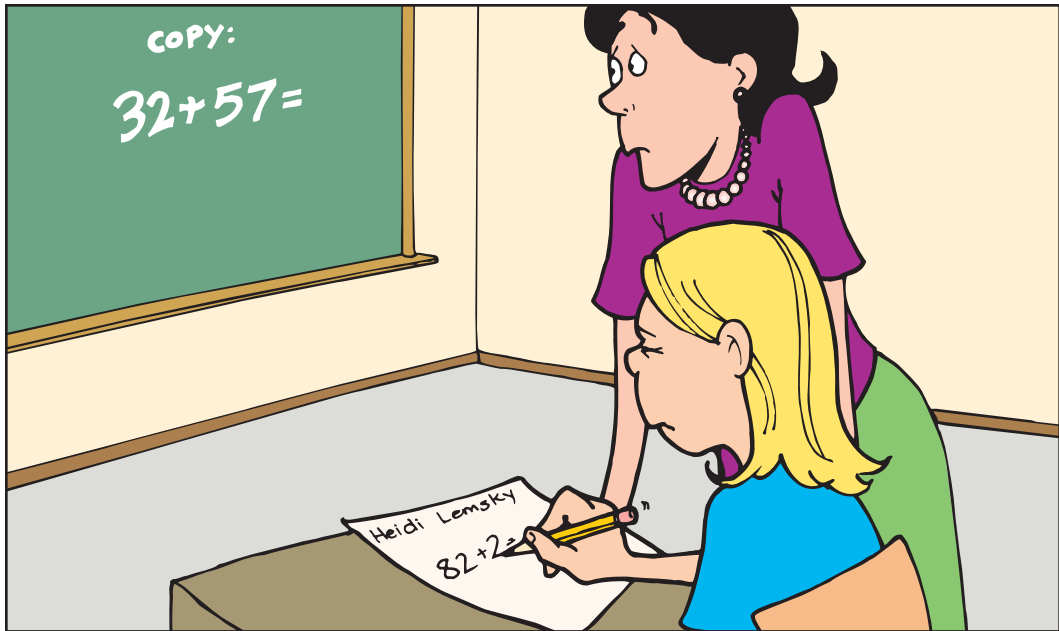
Tell me the main idea of all these details.
