3. Why is the girl crying?

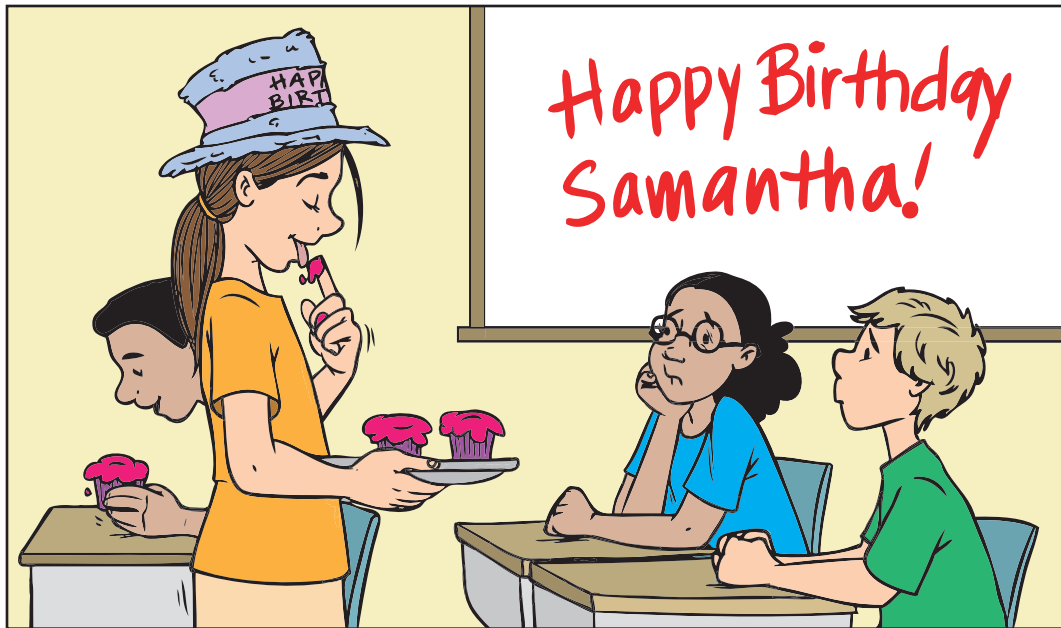
Her glasses are broken.

4. Why are broken glasses a problem for the girl?

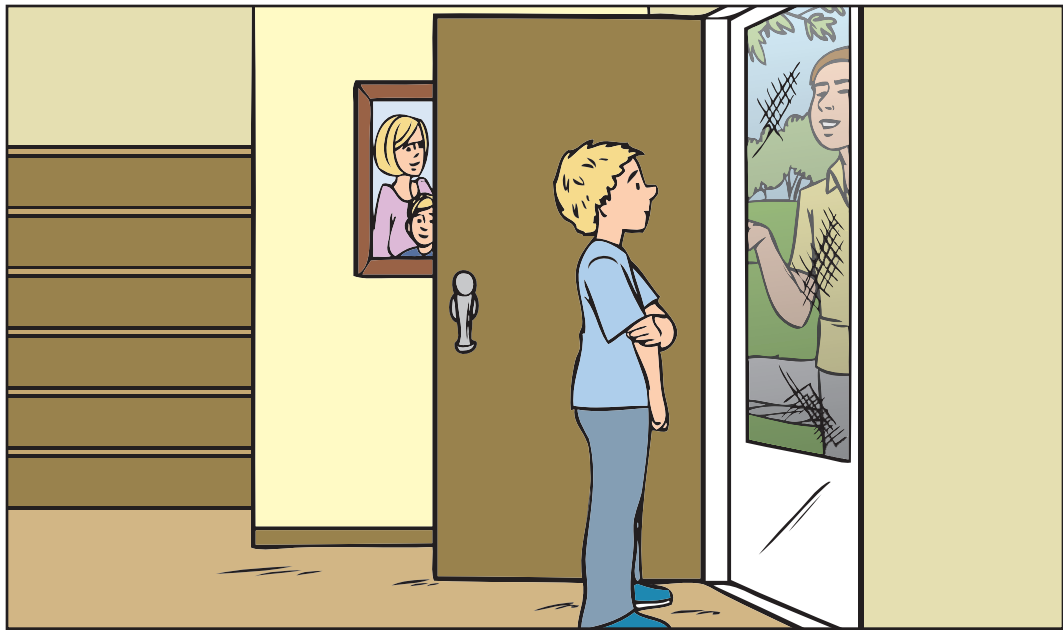
She won't be able to see well.
