

Description of Levels and Tasks

In Level A, pictures of 20 functional objects are presented. The pictures are photographed in both color and black-and-white to allow for a variety of tasks and difficulty levels. Duplicate color photographs allow for matching tasks. Each object is named on a word card.

In Level B, each of the 20 objects is shown in a simple location. A sentence card describes the object and the location. The card introduces a preposition and a second functional noun.

In Level C, the photographs represent people using the 20 original objects. A sentence card describes each picture. Attention is shifted to the action. The pictures in this level provide opportunities for the clinician to introduce the pronouns *he*, *she*, and *it*, as appropriate.

In Level D, the concept of location is expanded. The sentence cards describe each of the 20 objects in a complex location. The complexity of the pictures allows for increased task variety.

In Level E, the concept of sequencing is introduced. Twelve sequencing series are presented. Each category contains three sequencing series. The sequencing sets range in level of complexity from three to five stimuli.

In Level F, the reasoning concept of same/different is targeted. This level shows pictures that vary from the original 20 stimuli.

In Level G, the area of problem solving is addressed. The picture cards represent daily problems and require the patient to generate an appropriate solution.
